Katie Beirne, Legislative Director for U.S. Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY), was born on the West Side of Cleveland, Ohio, where she was raised and Catholicschooled with her seven brothers and sisters. She graduated from the University of Notre Dame, where she majored in Government and International Studies. While at Notre Dame, Katie was awarded a Truman and Marshall Scholarship. With the Marshall, Katie pursued a M.Sc. from the London School of Economics in Comparative Politics and an M.A. from Queens University Belfast in Ethnic Conflict Regulation.

After graduate school, Beirne worked as an investment banking associate at Lehman Brothers in New York City. In 2002, she relocated to Washington, D.C., to venture into politics and public policy. Beirne worked as a vice president for the economic consulting firm, Competition Policy Associates, Inc. (a subsidiary of FTI Consulting). In 2005, she entered the campaign world, serving as Policy Director for the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee chaired by Senator Schumer. After the 2006 Senate elections, she was brought on to Senator Schumer's Legislative Director working on policy and legislative strategy.

Age: 34 Place of birth: Pittsburgh, PA First job: Babysitter. What it taught me: That I really love working with children. Family: Husband Brian Lopresti; sons Patrick (3) and Owen (4 months). Irish roots: My mother's grandparents were from counties Kerry and Clare. Best

advice anyone ever gave me: You get as much out of things as you put into them. Best advice I could give someone starting out: Don't be afraid to put everything you have into something you are passionate about.

Julia Bell has been involved in Irish dancing since the age of five, when her mother, Sheila, enrolled her and her sister Eileen in classes with Theresa Burke. Bell evolved into a highly competitive dancer, consistently placing among the top three regionally and the top 15 nationally.

Although a seasoned performer and competitor, Bell's passion is for teaching dance. After graduating from Penn State in 1996, she became a certified Irish Dance teacher (T.C.R.G) and began teaching with the Burke School. In 1999, Bell founded the Bell School of Irish Dance, teaching on weekends around her full-time job. She soon quit her day job to give her growing school her full attention.

"I knew I would be taking a big risk, but at some point I just had to go for it," Bell would later explain. It proved to be the right decision. Since then, the Bell School has become the largest Irish dance school in the area, with over 350 students who compete at all levels and perform locally. The Bell School has already produced several world championship qualifiers -- no small feat for such a young school. However, the size and competitiveness of her school is secondary to the personal relationship Bell builds with her students. She strives to provide all of her dancers with a rewarding and character-building experience regardless of their competitive interests.

In 2004, Bell took the grueling exam to become a certified adjudicator of Irish dance (A.D.C.R.G) just months after her 30th birthday, the minimum age requirement. She was the only candidate in North America to pass that year, earning a credential shared by only 100 other Americans. ≝₩

Michael K. Breen



Age: 39 Place of birth: Rockville Centre, NY My first job, and what it taught me: The summer prior to my freshman year at the College of the Holy Cross, I worked for a construction company building single-family homes and small office buildings. Most of the first 25 years of my life

were to be focused not on manual labor, but on school and academics. Since completing my education, I have been a practicing lawyer, a decidedly different career than construction worker. Accordingly, that summer was a unique experience for me, an opportunity to leave

books and classrooms and computers behind, and spend the days instead with dry-wall, power tools, and lumber, and with men for whom college was not in the plans. I value the perspective the experience provided me, the broadening of my understanding of

the diversity of the American workplace. Working in construction industry also gave me valuable knowledge in my chosen area of law: real estate development. Family: Sheri (spouse); Conor, Shannon and Alanna (children). Irish roots: Dual citizen, U.S. and Éire. Maternal grandmother from Roscommon; paternal grandfather from Kerry. Best advice anyone ever gave me: "Téip (failure) is the foreigner's concept. We Irish set sail with hope." Best advice I could give someone starting out: "Building a network is like buying an option on a future opportunity."

Michael K. Breen has put into action his passion for the preservation of the Irish language. Last year, Michael founded Mary's Gift Irish Language Foundation, Inc., a U.S.-based public charity supporting Irish language education for the children of northeastern Ireland. When launched in the spring of 2009, Mary's Gift will collect and manage a charitable fund providing financial support to Irish language schools in northeastern Ireland. Similar in concept to U.S.-based college endowment funds, Mary's Gift will invest the donations it receives and distribute earnings to schools that teach through the medium of Irish. The foundation's roots are in Ireland, as the website and digital media programs were developed by Mitchell Kane Associates, a West Belfast-based media company. Mary's Gift is named in honor of Breen's grandmother, Mary Clifford, who hails from Co. Roscommon.

Breen serves on the national Board of Directors for the Irish-American Unity Conference. He is the treasurer for his local chapter in northern New Jersey, and writes the chapter's monthly newsletter. Breen is also a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.

When not engaged in Irish pursuits, Michael practices law in New Jersey and New York, and is the youngest lawyer ever to be made partner at his firm, Price, Meese, Shulman, and D'Arminio, P.C. As an accomplished lawyer and public speaker, he is frequently tapped to present lectures and seminars in his area of law.

Breen also devotes time to a number of other volunteer positions. He is a member of the Board of Trustees for Dominican College in Orangeburg, New York. Michael is also a trustee for the College of the Holy Cross Alumni Association of New Jersey. An Eagle Scout, he serves on the Legal and Administration Group for the Northern New Jersey Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Brendan Burke

Brendan Burke is the founder of Wild Rover Clothing. He comes from a large working class Irish and Irish-American family, and has nearly 40 first cousins in the tri-state area & Ireland.

Burke attended Rye Neck High School, graduating in 2000. He started his undergraduate studies in management at Hartwick College in Oneonta, N.Y., and later transferred to SUNY Oneonta, where he earned a degree in Communication Studies in May 2005. He currently works as an Account Manager at Security Services & Technologies (now ADT-Advanced Integration). There he provides direct support for senior management and their Fortune 500 clients, while focusing on business development and building his own book of business.

Burke has been inspired by his roots. He has visited the West of Ireland several times to stay with family, and it still leaves him awestruck to think his life in NYC originated from the small coal mining town in the hills. He uses this evolution, and Irish music, as the inspiration for Wild Rover. The line aims to capture the spirit of the two cultures that Brendan has been immersed in since birth, using the elegant designs and words of those who established Irish identity through the centuries.

managh. My mother, Margaret (Babs) Lynch, is from Drumeela, Co. Leitrim. **Best advice anyone ever gave me:** What is meant for you will not pass you. **Best advice I could give someone starting out:** The same.

Nollaig Cleary is the second youngest of seven children. She received her early education at St Mary's P.S. Killesher and Convent Grammar School Enniskillen. She graduated from UCD in 1993 with a Bachelor's Degree in Physiotherapy. She emigrated to the U.S. in 1993, to take a Physical Therapy position at Our Lady of Mercy Medical Center in the Bronx. She is currently employed at the Montefiore North Division.

Cleary comes from a strong GAA background, and upon her arrival in New York, she found herself involved in the GAA through her work. Nollaig joined Fermanagh GFC in 1995, and became club secretary in 1996. In November 2004, she was elected president of the Co. Fermanagh Association and has been to the fore in reviving the organization. Over the past few years the association's membership has increased, and Cleary has been instrumental in bridging the gap between the Gaelic Football club and the association.

Cleary was instrumental in starting Fermanagh Ladies GFC in 2000 and is the current club chairperson. In 2003, she was elected as chairperson of Cumann Peil Gael Na mBan Nua Eabhrac, a position she still holds today. One of her first initiatives as chairperson was starting Gaelic 4 Girls, which offers instruction in Gaelic football skills to underage girls in New York. The program is coached by New York Ladies team members and has steadily grown with teams at every age group participating in games here in the U.S. and in Feile Peil Na n-Og in Ireland. While at the reins of Cumann Peil Gael Na mBan she has hosted the TG4/O'Neill's Ladies All-stars, TG4 Underdogs and numerous other teams from Ireland.

Cleary is an active board member of the Aisling Irish Community Center and has also been involved with the Irish Lobby for Immigration Reform as they push for a comprehensive immigration reform bill. She has traveled to Washington D.C. to lobby on behalf of the organizations she represents. Cleary has been actively involved in fundraising for both organizations and for many other benefits and causes throughout the Irish community.
